For Sama

2019, Waad Al-Khateab, Edward Watts, 100m, Syria, UK MA15+

This internationally acclaimed, Oscar-nominated film gives intimate, devastating insight into life in war-torn Syria, with a young documentary recording her life over a five-year period during which she gives birth to a daughter, Sama. Should she stay and keep struggling for a better future, or try to flee? *Arabic with English subtitles.* **8, 13 July**



Honey Boy

Nestled in an isolated mountain region deep within the Balkans, the last in a long line of Macedonian wild beekeepers ekes out a living farming honey in small batches to be sold in the closest city. The peaceful existence is thrown into upheaval by the arrival of an itinerant family, with their roaring engines, seven rambunctious children and herd of cattle. *Macedonian with English subtitles.* **22, 25 July**



Meeting Gorbachev

Werner Herzog's riveting documentary celebrates Gorbachev's three remarkable accomplishments: negotiations with the U.S. to reduce nuclear weapons; cessation of Soviet control of Eastern Europe and the reunification of Germany; and the dissolution of the Soviet Union and Eastern Bloc. A feel-good adventure with outstanding performances from Shia LaBeouf and Zack Gottsagen. A young man with Down Syndrome runs away from a residential nursing home. 80m, Australia CTC

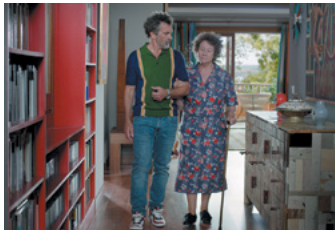

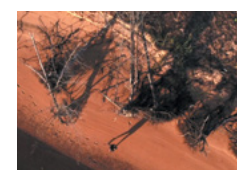
