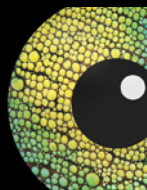

2018, Pawel Pawlikowski, Poland
14, 24, 29 June

A passionate love story between a man and a woman who meet in the ruins of post-war Poland. Set against the background of the Cold War in 1950s Poland, Berlin, Yugoslavia and Paris, it's the tale of a couple separated by politics, character flaws and unfortunate twists of fate - an impossible love story in impossible times. *Polish with English Subtitles.*

Free Solo (M) 100m

2018, Elizabeth Chai Vasarhelyi, Jimmy Chin, USA

A stunning, intimate and unflinching portrait of the free soloist climber Alex Honnold, as he prepares to achieve his lifelong dream: climbing the face of the world's most famous rock, the 3,000ft El Capitan in Yosemite National Park, without a rope.

High Life (MA15+) 113m

2018, Claire Denis, UK | France

Monte and his baby daughter are the last survivors of a damned and dangerous mission to deep space. The crew has vanished. As the mystery of what happened on-board the ship is unravelled, father and daughter must rely on each other to survive as they hurtle toward the oblivion of a black hole.

Manta Ray (CTC) 105m

2018 Phuttiphong Aroonpheng, Thailand

Near a coastal village of Thailand, by the sea where thousands of Rohingya refugees have drowned, a local fisherman rescues a stranger, offers him his friendship and names him Thongchai. The Extraordinary Journey of the Fakir (M) 96m

2019, Ken Scott, Belgium

The story of Ajatashatru Oghash Rathod, a fakir who tricks his local village in Rajasthan, India into believing his possesses special powers and into paying him to fly to Paris to buy a bed of nails from an IKEA store.

The Happy Prince (MA15+) 100m

2018, Tony Prescott, UK
5, 13, 17 June

Oscar Wilde lies on his deathbed and recalls his past with wit and irony. Was he once the most famous man in London? He reviews the failed attempt to reconcile with his long-suffering wife, the ensuing reprisal of his love affair with Lord Alfred Douglas and the devotion of Robbie Ross.

The Kid Who Would Be King (PG) 120m

A heart-warming tale of a young female farmer and her imaginary friend. He's been by her side for twenty years and counting. Now, as he watches her fall for another man - a real man - it dawns on him: he is in love with her. Unable to face losing her, he must fight to become real himself.

The Sisters Brothers (MA15+) 122m

27 June | 3, 6 July

Eli and Charlie Sisters are hired to kill a prospector who has stolen from their boss. A reimagining of the cinematic Western as a dangerous, witty, and emotionally cathartic exploration of what it means to be a man.

Toy Story 4 (G) 92m

As fascism spreads, German refugee Georg flees to Marseille and assumes the identity of the dead writer whose transit papers he is carrying.
