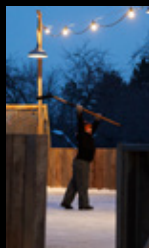
Top Dog Film Festival - Tuesday 13 August

Mimal Independence - Emma Masters

Thursday 25 July - October 25, 2017 marked a new era for Indigenous landowners and managers in south central Arnhem Land, Mimal Land Management has gained full independence, almost 20 years after Mimal Rangers first began. *Followed by "Little Woods" (M)*



Gamba grass: A weed that's killing country -

Emma Masters - Thursday 1 August - Gamba grass is an invasive, damaging weed that has spread across large parts of the Northern Territory – and it's threatening our country. Mimal has joined forces with Bushfires NT, Jawoyn Rangers and Territory NRM to understand how we can help fight its spread and make sure it doesn't take over our country. *Followed by "In Like Flynn" (MA15+)*



Fire birds - Emma Masters - Thursday 8 August

Mimal Land Management has been caring for country and managing fire for many years. We have a special bird connected to fire, a bird we call Karrkanj. This "troublemaker" picks up burning sticks of fire and flies to a fresh piece of grass and drops it to create new fire. *Followed by "The Reports on Sarah and Saleem" (MA15+)*



Darwin in the Wet - Vijay Daniels - Thursday 15 August

Sue Moffitt shares her love for Darwin in the wet. Travelling with her husband Ken around Australia for five years she ended up in Darwin in the tropical summer. Captain Blood (PG) 94m

1935, Michael Curtiz, USA

Errol Flynn leads the cast in this classic tale of peril and heroism on the high seas. Irish physician Peter Blood is condemned to slavery in Jamaica. Here he earns privileges after treating the governor for gout; this does not rest well with the owner of the plantation on which Blood is forced to work.

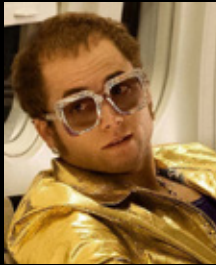


Palm Beach (CTC) 100m

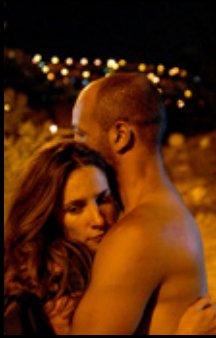


The Man Who Killed Don Quixote (M) 133m

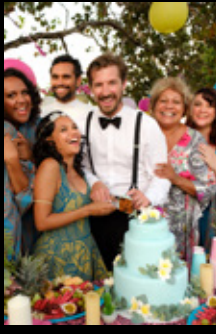


The Reports on Sarah and Saleem (MA15+) 132m
