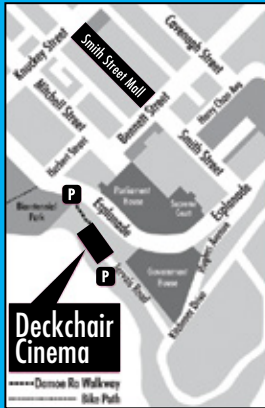

2019 Lee Chang-Dong, South Korea | 26, 31 Oct

This remarkable thriller was the most acclaimed film of Cannes. Novelistic in scope, grandeur and impact, and featuring three brilliant performances, it's a gripping psychological study of thwarted love, ambition and obsession. *Korean with English subtitles.*

Celeste (M) 106m

2019 Ben Hackworth, Australia | 6, 9, 11 Nov

Celeste was once Australia's most beloved opera singer. Yet she threw it all away to follow the man she loved to a crumbling property deep in the rainforests of Tropical North Queensland. Ten years after his tragic death, Celeste is ready to make one final return to the stage.

Dora and the Lost City of Gold (PG) 101m

2019 James Bobin, USA | 13, 15 Nov

Dora faces her most dangerous adventure ever - High School. Always the explorer, Dora quickly finds herself leading a rag tag group of teens on an adventure to save her parents and solve the impossible mystery behind a lost city of gold.

2019 Nisha Ganatra, USA | 23, 28 Sep | 5 Oct

Katherine Newbury (Emma Thompson) is a pioneer and legendary host on the late-night talk-show circuit. When she's accused of being a "woman who hates women," she puts affirmative action on the to-do list, and - presto! - Molly is hired as the one woman in Katherine's all-male writers' room.

Midsommar (R18+) 147m

2019 Ari Aster, USA | 19, 25 Oct

From the visionary mind of Ari Aster comes a dread soaked cinematic fairy-tale where a world of darkness unfolds in broad daylight. Dani and Christian are a young American couple on a once-in-a-lifetime midsummer festival in a remote Swedish village that takes a sinister turn.

Never Look Away (M) 189m

2019 Florian Henckel Von Bismarck, Germany | 11 Oct

The story of a young art student, Kurt who falls in love with fellow student, Ellie. Ellie's father, Professor Seeband, a famous doctor, is dismayed at his daughter's choice of boyfriend, and vows to destroy the relationship. What neither of them knows is that their lives are already connected through a terrible crime Seeband committed decades ago. *German with English subtitles.*

Once Upon a Time in Hollywood (MA15+) 161m

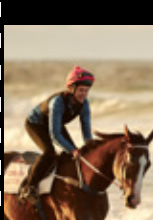
2019 Quentin Tarrantino, USA | 21 Oct | 7 Nov

Quentin Tarantino's 9th film visits 1969 Los Angeles, where everything is changing, as TV star Rick Dalton (Leonardo DiCaprio) and his long-time stunt double Cliff Booth (Brad Pitt) make their way around an industry they hardly recognise anymore.

Parasite (MA15+) 132m

2019 Bong Joon Ho, South Korea | 5, 22 Oct

Ki-woo is recommended by his friend for a well-paid tutoring job. Carrying the expectations of his family, Ki-woo heads to the Park family home for an interview. Arriving at the house of Mr. Park, the owner of a global IT firm, Ki-woo sets off an unstoppable string of mishaps. *Korean with English subtitles.*



Ride Like A Girl (CTC) 98m

2019 Rachel Griffiths, Australia | 28 Oct | 1, 8 Nov

The Australian feel-good sports movie of the season follows Michelle Payne chasing the impossible dream of winning horse racing's toughest 2 mile race – the Melbourne Cup. Family tragedy and a near fatal fall endanger her dream but she secures a spot. Up against 100 to 1 odds, the rest is history.

She Who Must Be Loved (CTC) 90m

2019 Erica Glynn, Australia | 30 Oct

She Who Must Be Loved is a documentary that tells the epic life story of Alfreda Glynn – 78 year old Aboriginal woman, stills photographer, co-founder of the Central Australian Aboriginal Media Association (CAAMA), and Imparja TV, mother, grandmother, great grandmother, radical, pacifist, grumpy old woman, who in equal measure loves the limelight and total privacy.

The Australian Dream (MA15+) 105m

2019 Daniel Gordon, Australia | 7, 15 Oct

From shy country kid to two-time Brownlow medallist and Australian of the Year, Goodes is an inspiration to many. Goodes' world fell apart when he became the target of racial abuse during a game, which spiralled into a public backlash against him. He spoke out about racism when Australia was not ready to hear the ugly truth.

The Big Bad Fox and Other Tales (G) 82m

2019 Benjamin Renner, Patrick Imbert, France
2, 8 Nov

A hilarious, heart-warming tale of animal misfits destined to become a classic. The countryside isn't always as calm and peaceful as it's made out to be, and the animals on this farm are particularly agitated: a fox who mothers a family of chicks, a rabbit who plays the stork, and a duck who wants to be Santa Claus.

The Dead Don't Die (Unclassified 15+) 103m

2019 Jim Jarmusch, USA | 5, 14, 16 Nov

A cult comedy favourite in the making with Iggy Pop as a zombie. Something's not quite right in Centerville. The moon hangs large and low in the sky, the hours of daylight are becoming unpredictable. The strangest and most dangerous condition starts plaguing Centerville: *The Dead Don't Die!*

The Extraordinary Journey of the Fakir (M) 96m

2019 Ken Scott, Belgium | 9, 18 Oct

Aja arrives in Paris in search of his destiny. He falls in love with Marie in an IKEA store, and plans to meet up with her again the next day. When he gets stuck in a wardrobe shipped in the night to the UK, Aja finds himself on the run from border police and bandits alike.

The Farewell (PG) 100m

2019 Lulu Wang, USA | 24, 26 Oct | 4 Nov

In this funny, uplifting tale based on an actual lie, Chinese-born, U.S.-raised Billi reluctantly returns to Changchun to find that, although the whole family knows their beloved matriarch, Nai-Nai, has been given mere weeks to live, everyone has decided not to tell Nai Nai herself.

The Muppet Movie (G) 98m

1979 Jim Henson, USA | 4 Oct

Join us for a 40th anniversary screening of the family classic! After a fateful meeting with a big-time talent agent, Kermit the Frog heads for Hollywood dreaming of showbiz. But all bets are off when Kermit falls into the clutches of Doc Hopper, a fast-food mogul seeking to promote his French-fried frog-leg franchise!

The White Crow (M) 127m

2019 Ralph Finnes, UK | 8, 14, 18 Oct

Inspired by the book Rudolf Nureyev: The Life by Julie Kavanagh. The drama charts the iconic dancer's famed defection from the Soviet Union to the West in 1961, despite KGB efforts to stop him.

Top End Wedding (M) 103m

2019 Wayne Blair, Australia | 30 Sep | 3 Oct | 15 Nov

Lauren and Ned have just ten days to find Lauren's mother who is AWOL somewhere in the Northern Territory, reunite her parents and pull off their dream wedding. As the couple travel through the wild beauty of Australia's Northern Territory landscapes they meet unforgettable characters, find fulfilment and Lauren learns why her mother had to leave to find home.

Under the Silver Lake (MA15+) 139m
