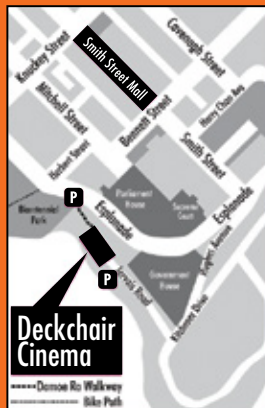

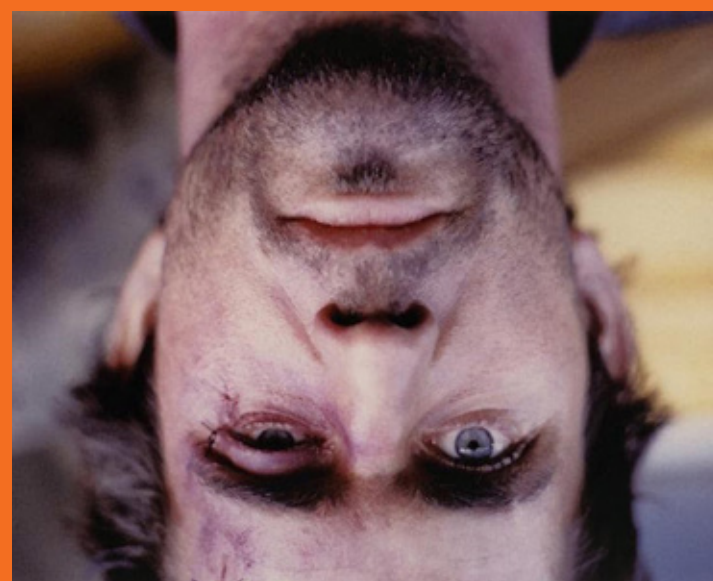

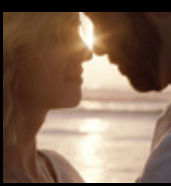


### Two is a Family (M) 118m
