Last Cab to Darwin CLOSING NIGHT – Sunday 20 November

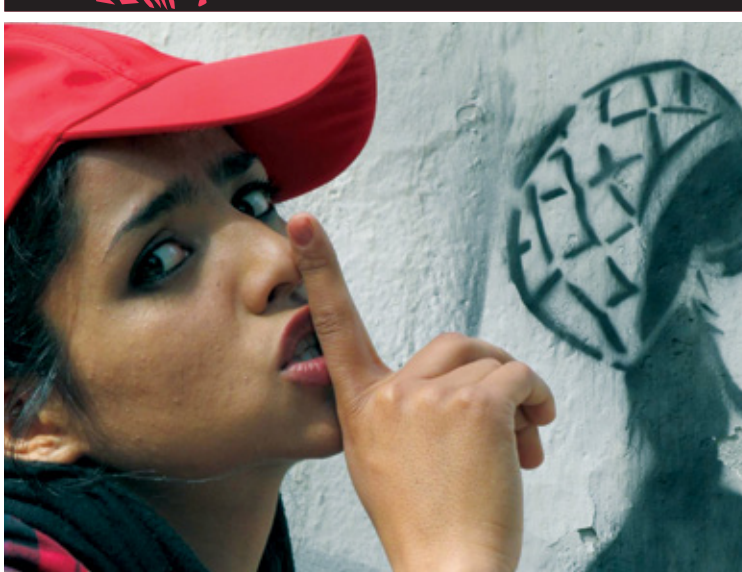
To celebrate reaching the 1000-member milestone this year, we handed the programming reigns to DFS members for our Closing Night film!

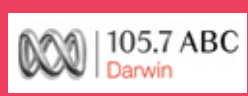

2015, Christian Duguay, France
1 & 9 October

Based on the classic French children's novel, orphan Sebastian and his dependable Pyrenees Mountain Dog, Belle, must find their adopted mother, who they believe has survived a plane crash. French with English subtitles.



The BFG (PG) 117m

2016, Steven Spielberg, UKA | Canada | USA
3 & 18 November

Steven Spielberg brings this Roald Dahl classic to life. When an orphan called Sophie accidentally sees a giant on the streets of London, she is captured and taken to Giant Land.



The Clan (MA15+) 110m

2015, Pablo Trapero, Argentina | Spain
25 & 29 October, 4 November

Based on shocking real events, the Puccios appeared to be an ordinary middle-class Argentinian family. But in the 70s and 80s, the family's patriarch, Arquímedes, masterminded a series of money-driven kidnappings. Spanish with English subtitles.



Dingo (PG) 109m

1991, Rolf de Heer, Australia
28 October

Young John Anderson (Colin Friels) is captivated by jazz musician Billy Cross (Miles Davis in his only film appearance) and his band when they perform on the local airstrip in the Kimberley after their plane is diverted. Years later, he still dreams of joining Billy in Paris.



Downriver (MA15+) 99m

2015, Grant Scicluna, Australia
4, 12 & 16 November

James (Reef Ireland) returns from juvenile detention over the disappearance of a boy years earlier. But will finding the boy's remains offer deliverance, or dredge up painful truths and family secrets?



Down Under (MA15+) 90m

2016, Abe Forsyth, Australia
9 & 11 November

With a uniquely Australian mix of slapstick comedy, uncomfortable truths and unnervingly familiar caricatures, *Down Under* follows two carloads of testosterone-fuelled hot-heads in the aftermath the now-infamous Cronulla riots.



Embrace of the Serpent (M) 125m

2015, Ciro Guerra, Columbia | Venezuela
2 & 21 October, 1 November

In this dream-like film told in two parallel narratives set 30 years apart, Karamakate is an Amazonian shaman, and last survivor from his tribe. Winner of the Oscar for Best Foreign Language film. Spanish, Portuguese and German with English subtitles.



Freedom Stories (PG) 99m

2015, Steve Thomas, Australia
17 October

A timely documentary about the achievements of so-called 'boat people' who fled their homelands to find peace and freedom. Here they tell their personal stories of escape, detention and making Australia home.



Girl Asleep (M) 77m

2015, Rosemary Myers, Australia
30 September, 3 & 18 October

A coming of age story set in 70s Australian suburbia, Greta is perfectly happy being a high school nobody when she is thrust into an oddly psychedelic parallel world at her surprise party.



Goldstone (M) 109m

2016, Ivan Sen, Australia
5, 14 & 30 October

In this taut and intelligent thriller, an Indigenous detective (Aaron Pedersen) gets more than he bargained for when he arrives in a small outback town to investigate a missing persons case.



Lights Out (M) 81m

2016, David F. Sandberg, USA
22 & 31 October

A fright-filled supernatural horror flick not for the faint of heart, Rebecca (Teresa Palmer) must uncover the past to stop a bloodthirsty and vengeful ghost from destroying her family.



Love and Friendship (PG) 92m

2016, Whilt Stillman, Ireland | Netherlands | UK
26 Sep, 1 & 19 Oct, 19 Nov

An attractive widow seeks a suitable husband for her daughter and herself - and throws polite society into a palaver. Based on Jane Austen's humorous novel and comedy of manners.



Maggie's Plan (M) 98m

2015, Susanna White, USA
2, 7 & 19 November

When Maggie (Greta Gerwig) becomes involved with a married man, (Ethan Hawke), and things don't work out, she resolves to reunite him with his wife (Julianne Moore) in this screw-ball (anti-) romantic comedy.



Miles Ahead (M) 100m

2015, Don Cheadle, USA
23 & 28 October

Don Cheadle (also a co-writer) plays Miles Davis in this biopic, exploring the life and career of the jazz legend via an imagined encounter between Davis and a journalist (Ewan McGregor).



Mustang (M) 97m

2015, Deniz Gamze Ergüven, France | Germany | Turkey | Qatar
30 September, 8 & 24 October

A heart-wrenching coming of age story set in Turkey. When five orphaned sisters are caught socialising with some local boys, their guardians fear for their reputations and resort to drastic measures. Turkish with English subtitles.



Our Kind of Traitor (MA15+) 108m

2016, Susanna White, UK | France
14 & 29 October, 15 November

A white knuckled spy thriller based on John Le Carre's novel, a school teacher (Ewan McGregor) is drawn into high level espionage by a charismatic and mysterious Russian he meets on vacation.



The Red Turtle (PG) 80m

2016, Michael Dudok de Wit, Japan | France | Belgium
22 October, 13 November

A man marooned on an island has his escape attempts thwarted by a mysterious red turtle. Stunningly animated, this is a beautiful and moving allegory about the circle of life.



Sing Street (M) 106m

2016, John Carney, Ireland | UK
27 Sep, 7 Oct, 12 & 18 Nov

Invoking a veritable memory lane of 80s music, Sing Street is the heartwarming and hilarious story of Conor from working class Dublin who forms a band to win a girl.



Sonita (CTC) 90m

2015, Rokhsareh Ghaemmaghami, Germany | Switzerland
7 & 11 October

A Sundance award-winning documentary, Sonita tells the story of a 14-year old Afghan refugee and aspiring rapper whose estranged mother wants to sell her into marriage to support the family. Farsi with English subtitles



Swiss Army Man (M) 97m

2016, Dan Kwan, Daniel Scheinert, USA
4, 15 & 21 October

A desperate Hank (Paul Dano) is marooned on an island when he notices a body (Daniel Radcliffe) washed ashore. An award-winning and critically acclaimed whimsical oddball buddy comedy (of sorts).



Three (MA15+) 88m

2016, Johnny To, Hong Kong | China
10 & 16 October

This tension-packed action flick is a ticking-clock thriller set in a hospital about a wounded criminal with an escape plan, the cop who shot him and the surgeon trying to keep him alive. Cantonese with English subtitles.



The Wait (CTC) 90m

2015, Piero Messina, Italy | France
8 October, 5 & 14 November

In this slow-burning, artistically shot drama, Jeanne is waiting for her fiancée while staying with his mother in Sicily (Juliette Binoche). As time passes it becomes clear that something isn't right. French and Italian with English subtitles.



Where to Invade Next (M) 120m

2015, Michael Moore, USA
6 November

Michael Moore returns with his signature brand of investigative journalism revealing ugly truths. This time, he 'invades' foreign countries, comparing US domestic policy – like health and education – against other nations.
