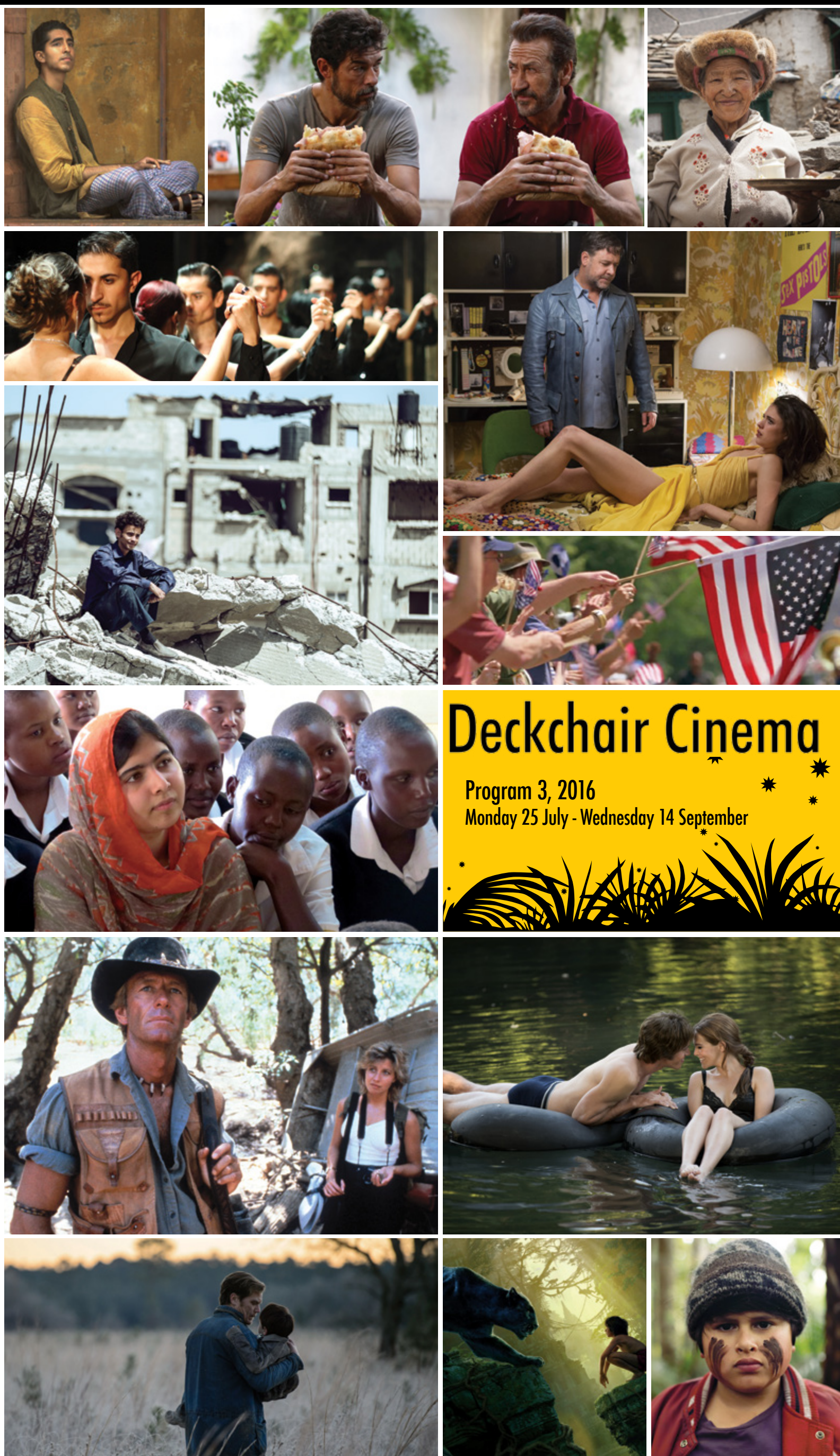
Sunday 28 August

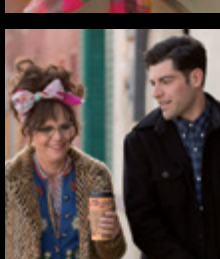


He Named Me Malala (PG) 88m

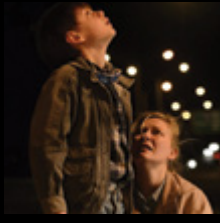


Hunt for the Wilderpeople (PG) 101m
