Aferim! (CTC) 108m

2015, Radu Jude, Romania/Bulgaria/

Czech Republic/France

3 July, 8 July, 18 July

Awash with gallows humour delivered in deadpan style, *Aferim!* is set in 1830s Romania, and follows the adventures of a local policeman enlisted to track down a runaway Gypsy slave. Romanian with English subtitles.

Queer film hits the road with this drama about a sexy DJ who is forced to run when she stumbles upon a stash of cash. Can she keep the money, conquer her demons and get the girl?

A Month of Sundays (PG) 110m

2015, Matthew Saville, Australia

27 June, 13 July, 20 July

Real estate agent Frank is moored by regrets, until one night he gets a phone call from his dead mother. A comedy that argues that even real estate agents deserve a second chance.

Boy and the World (CTC) 85m

2014, Alê Abreu, Brazil

11 June, 4 July

Cuca leaves his cozy rural life when he heads to the city, embarking on a lyrical, visual, musical odyssey, the animation taking on greater complexity as his small world expands. Suitable for children aged 4 years and up.

Broke (MA15+) 105m

2016, Heath Davis, Australia

10 July

A disgraced rugby league star attempts to turn his life around with the help of a devoted fan, digging deep to apply the spirit he once displayed on the field to his personal life.

Labyrinth (G) 101m

1986, Jim Henson, UK/USA

2 July, 22 July

A much-loved cult classic, this fantasy/adventure film is testament to Jim Henson's creative genius and stars the late, great David Bowie in one of the most iconic film roles of his career.

Mia Madre (M) 106m

2016, Nanni Moretti, Italy/France/Germany

9 July, 15 July

Film director Margherita is struggling to balance artistic ambition with everyday life. A semi-autobiographical tale, *Mia Madre* is another rich and affecting humanist work from great Italian auteur Moretti. Italian with English subtitles.

2015, Anna Boden & Ryan Fleck, USA

17 June, 24 June, 17 July

Two gamblers make their way down the Mississippi River to a legendary high stakes poker game in New Orleans. A lively, freewheeling road movie subtly offset by an existential shadow.

1978, Philip Noyce, Australia

13 June

Newsfront scriptwriter Bob Ellis, who recently passed away, remained a fierce supporter of a strong and distinctly Australian film industry. In post-war Australia the men and women of Cinetone struggle to produce the weekly newsreels for the film going public. An Australian classic.

Purple Rain (M) 111m

1984, Albert Magnoli, USA

22 July

Purple Rain was partly made to showcase the talents of the artist who was to become one of the giants of contemporary music, and contains a slew of Prince hits including "Purple Rain" and "When Doves Cry".

Rams (M) 93m

2015, Grímur Hákonarson, Iceland

12 June, 18 June, 15 July

Majestically shot in a spectacular, wind and snow-swept valley, this fable of two brothers begins as a droll comedy about rural life and grows into a graceful and mythic tale about family, community and legacy.

The Crow's Egg (PG) 91m

2014, M. Manikandan, India

11 June, 21 June, 26 June

Two children from the slums of Chennai go to extreme lengths to taste pizza for this first time. A bright and heartwarming film that includes a good measure of social conscience.

The Daughter (M) 96m

2015, Simon Stone, Australia

11 July, 16 July, 23 July

Vacant factory buildings and looming forest trees lend a bleak beauty to this well-crafted tale about the destructive power latent in long-maintained family secrets. Inspired by Henrik Ibsen's play *The Wild Duck*.

The Lady in the Van (M) 104m

2015, Nicholas Hytner, UK

12 June, 19 June

A wry comedy based on the true story of Miss Shepherd, a woman of uncertain origins who "temporarily" parked her van in writer Alan Bennett's London driveway and proceeded to live there for 15 years.

The Legend of Barney Thomson (MA15+) 96m

2015, Robert Carlyle, Canada/UK

14 June, 24 June, 2 July

An enjoyably macabre comedy about a socially inept Glaswegian barber wrongfully suspected as the coldblooded killer behind a recent spate of grisly murders in the city. Full to the brim with cult film potential.

The Sapphires (PG) 103m

2012, Wayne Blair, Australia

5 July

Set in the late 1960s, this ever-popular musical comedy is based on a true story, following four young Aboriginal women who form a music group named The Sapphires and travel to Vietnam to perform for troops during the war.

The Witch (MA15+) 93m

2015, Robert Eggers, USA/Canada

15 June, 25 June, 12 July

A thought-provoking and exquisitely-made horror film that follows a Puritan family in 1630 New England as they encounter forces of evil in the woods beyond their farm.

Wide Open Sky (G) 78m

2015, Lisa Nicol, Australia

25 June, 8 July, 24 July

An uplifting documentary about a children's choir in a remote corner of outback Australia, this doco chronicles the choir from early auditions through to the end of year concert.

Youth (MA15+) 124m

2015, Paolo Sorrentino, Italy/France

10 June, 18 June

Septuagenarian best friends Fred and Mick are on holiday in a luxury hotel in the Swiss Alps. A comedy interspersed with surreal sequences that reflects on age-old questions about life and death.



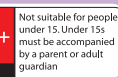
