#### FREE NAIDOC Week community screening Monday 6 July | Blood Brothers: Freedom Ride with short film Harry's War

Join us for a free community screening of *Harry's War*, a short film from the National Film and Sound Archive's Black Screen collection, followed by *Blood Brothers: Freedom Ride*. In 1965, students from the University of Sydney formed a group called the Student Action for Aborigines, led by Charles Perkins (an Arrente man born in Alice Springs and the first indigenous Australian to graduate tertiary education), to travel on a Freedom Ride through NSW country towns. Short film (26m) *Harry's War* is the perspective of an Aboriginal soldier in Japanese-occupied Papua New Guinea based on the real-life experiences of Falkland's uncle, Harry Saunders.

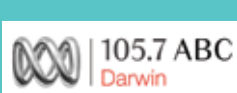
