2013, Luigi Acquistio / Bety Reis, East Timor
21, 25 April & 2, 6 May

This documentary about charismatic and inspirational Warumpi Band frontman, George Rurrumbu Burarrawanga, is filled with interviews, clips and music. It follows George's story from Elcho Island to his premature demise.

When her elder sister dies in childbirth, Shira an Orthodox Hassid living in Tel Aviv, must make the terrible choice between her heart's desire and her family duty. Hebrew with English subtitles



Gloria (MA 15+) 109m
2013, Sebastian Lelio, Chile / Spain
30 April & 4, 16 May
Invoking Laura Brangian's song Gloria this film is a tale of free-spirited, divorcée Gloria who refuses to accept her lonely life. Hitting Santiago's clubs she has an unexpected romantic encounter with a former naval officer, and is forced to confront her own dark secrets. Spanish with English Subtitles

Inside Llewyn Davis (M) 105m
2013, Ethan Coen / Joel Coen, USA
16, 19, 22 April & 2 May
The latest offer from the Coen Brothers follows a week in the life of a young folk singer as he navigates the Greenwich Village folk scene of 1961. Incisive, irresistible and at times tragically comical.



Kill Your Darlings (MA 15+) 103m
2013, John Krokidas, USA
27 April & 13, 24 May
In 1944 the great poets of the beat generation - Allen Ginsberg, Jack Kerouac and William Burroughs - are brought together. Kill Your Darlings recounts the pivotal year that changed Allen Ginsberg's life forever and provided the spark for him to start his creative revolution.



Mary & Max (PG) 92m
2009, Adam Elliot, Australia
18 April & 3 May
A tale of friendship between two unlikely pen pals: Mary, a lonely, eight-year-old girl living in the suburbs of Melbourne, and Max, a forty-four-year old, severely obese man living in New York. This 2009 Australian clay-animation features the voice of Philip Seymour Hoffman as Max.



Mongolian Bling (Unclassified 15+) 90m
2012, Benj Binks, Australia
18 May & 8 June
Hip hop that is making Mongolia move in the 21st century. But beyond this bling lies a failed democracy, and a dying ancient culture. While many artists still aspire to the West, a handful are using Mongolia's rich musical history in their modern beats and rhymes. English and Mongolian with English subtitles



Pussy Riot: A Punk Prayer (R 18+) 88m
2013, Mike Lerner / Maxim Pozdorovkin, Russia / UK
20 & 26 April
In February 2012, the three members of the Russian punk-rock group Pussy Riot went to church and performed 'Virgin Mary, Put Putin Away' in front of a shocked congregation. The women faced seven years in a Russian prison for this. Who is really on trial - three young artists or the society they live in? Russian with English subtitles



Synecdoche, New York (M) 118m
2008, Charlie Kaufman, USA

Philip Seymour Hoffman is Theatre Director, Caden Cotard, worried about the transience of his life. He gathers an ensemble cast into a warehouse in New York City, hoping to create a work of brutal honesty.



The Darkside (PG) 94m
2013, Warwick Thornton, Australia

An iconic Australian cast bring to life a collection of part documentary, part fiction ghost tales from across Australia. Honest, matter-of-fact firsthand accounts illuminate a black perspective on the other side.

Historical, fantasy animation directed by poet Hayao Miyazaki sees hero Jiro's dream of flying and designing beautiful airplanes soar as he grows to become one of the world's most accomplished airplane designers.

Robyn Davidson's phenomenal solo trek from Alice Springs to the Indian Ocean saw her traverse 2700km of spectacular yet unforgiving Australian desert accompanied only by her loyal dog and four unpredictable camels.
