A Gun In Each Hand (M) 95m
2013, Cesc Gay, Spain
28 Sep and 6, 18 Oct
Featuring one of the most star-studded, talented casts in modern Latin American cinema, *A Gun in Each Hand* is a witty and hilarious portrait of men in their 40's, and the changing gender roles of contemporary Spanish society. Spanish with English subtitles

Before Midnight (MA 15+) 109m
2013, Richard Linklater, USA
7, 12, 19 Oct
In the sequel to *Before Sunrise* and *Before Sunset*, we meet Jesse and Celine in Greece, almost two decades since their first meeting on that train bound for Vienna. Jesse and Céline are now parents to twin girls conceived when they got together for the second time. Jesse has continued to find success as a novelist, while Céline is at a career crossroads.



Before Sunset (M) 80m
2004, Richard Linklater, USA
12 Oct
It's 9 years after Jesse and Celine first met on a train in *Before Sunrise* (1995) and spent a night together in Vienna. Jesse has written a book about the encounter and during his European book tour, he reunites with Celine in Paris. They enjoy a picturesque walk in Paris which is peppered with intimate conversation.



Blancanieves (M) 100m
2012, Pablo Berger, Spain/France
25 Oct and 5, 15 Nov
Blancanieves is a uniquely spirited homage to the golden age of Europe's silent cinema. Set in a romanticized 1920s Spain, this film is a re-telling of the classic fairy tale *Snow White*. Snow White is Carmen, the daughter of a famous bullfighter, who lives under the tyrannical rule of her evil stepmother. She escapes and joins a troupe of bullfighters.



Cloudburst (MA 15+) 89m
2013, Thom Fitzgerald, Canada
11, 21 & 26 Oct
Stella and Dot are an aging couple who have faithfully accompanied one another through life's ups and downs. Now in their seventies, they will leave their hometown and make their way to Canada, where there's marriage equality. En route to Canada, they pick up a young hitchhiker. With equal parts humour and grace, *Cloudburst* explores the important themes of life, death and love.



Epic (PG) 102m
2013, Chris Wedge, USA

A teenager finds herself transported to a deep forest setting where a battle between the forces of good and evil is taking place. She bands together with a rag-tag group of characters in order to save their world - and ours.



Frances Ha (MA15+) 86m
2013, Noah Baumbach, USA
2, 15, 19, Oct
Frances is a 27-year-old dancer who lives with her best friend Sophie, but Sophie, who's got her act together moves out, leaving Frances to figure out how to live her life. New York is a great place to live and Frances throws herself headlong into her dreams, even as their possible reality dwindles. This modern fable explores youth, friendship, class, ambition, failure and redemption.



I'm So Excited! (MA 15+) 90m
2013, Pedro Almodovar, Spain
27 Oct and 9, 12 Nov
A technical issue has endangered Flight 2549. The pilots attempt to find a solution while the chief steward and the flight attendants try to forget their own personal problems and devote themselves, body and soul, to the task of making the flight as enjoyable as possible for the passengers. This comedy shows life in the clouds is as complicated as it is at ground level. Spanish with English subtitles



In The House (MA 15+) 101m
2012, Francois Ozon, France
20, 30 Oct and 13 Nov
A sixteen year old boy insinuates himself into the house of a fellow student from his literature class and writes about it in essays for his French teacher. Faced with this gifted and unusual pupil, the teacher rediscovers his enthusiasm for his work, but the boy's intrusion will unleash a series of uncontrollable events. This compelling mystery will leave you captivated. French with English subtitles



Lasseter's Bones (G) 101m
2013, Luke Walker, Australia
28 Oct and 16 Nov
In 1931 Harold Lasseter's body was found in Central Australia's deserts and his diary revealed that he'd found gold, worth millions as yet unfound. Documentary filmmaker Luke Walker finds Lasseter's 85 year-old son, still searching the desert, not only for gold, but something far more precious. Walker sets out to unravel the tangle of myths, lies and legend buried with Lasseter's bones in the heart of Australia.



Much Ado About Nothing (M) 108m
2013, Joss Whedon, USA

A modern retelling of Shakespeare's classic comedy about two pairs of lovers with different takes on romance and a way with words. A series of comic and tragic events may continue to keep the two couples from truly finding happiness, but then again love may prevail.



Mud (M) 108m

Mud is an adventure about two teenage boys who encounter a fugitive named Mud hiding out on an island in the Mississippi. Mud describes fantastic scenarios – he killed a man in Texas and vengeful bounty hunters are coming to get him but he says he is planning to escape with the love of his life, Juniper. Sceptical but intrigued, the boys agree to help him.



Mystery Road (M) 116m

This gripping murder mystery blends nail biting tension with outback Australian comedy. Indigenous police detective Jay Swan returns to his hometown after spending too many years in the big city. His first case is the murder of an Indigenous teenager. Alienated from the white dominated police force and the indigenous community he left behind, Jay struggles to fit in. Jay gradually unravels a complex crime web.

At 89, Les D'Arcy is a living legend, seven times world champion and still competing at the Table Tennis Championships. The Great Gatsby (M) 142m

In an adaptation of F. Scott Fitzgerald's classic novel set in Long Island, Midwesterner Nick Carraway is lured into the lavish world of his neighbour, Jay Gatsby. Soon enough, however, Carraway will see through the cracks of Gatsby's nouveau riche existence, where obsession, madness, and tragedy lurk.
