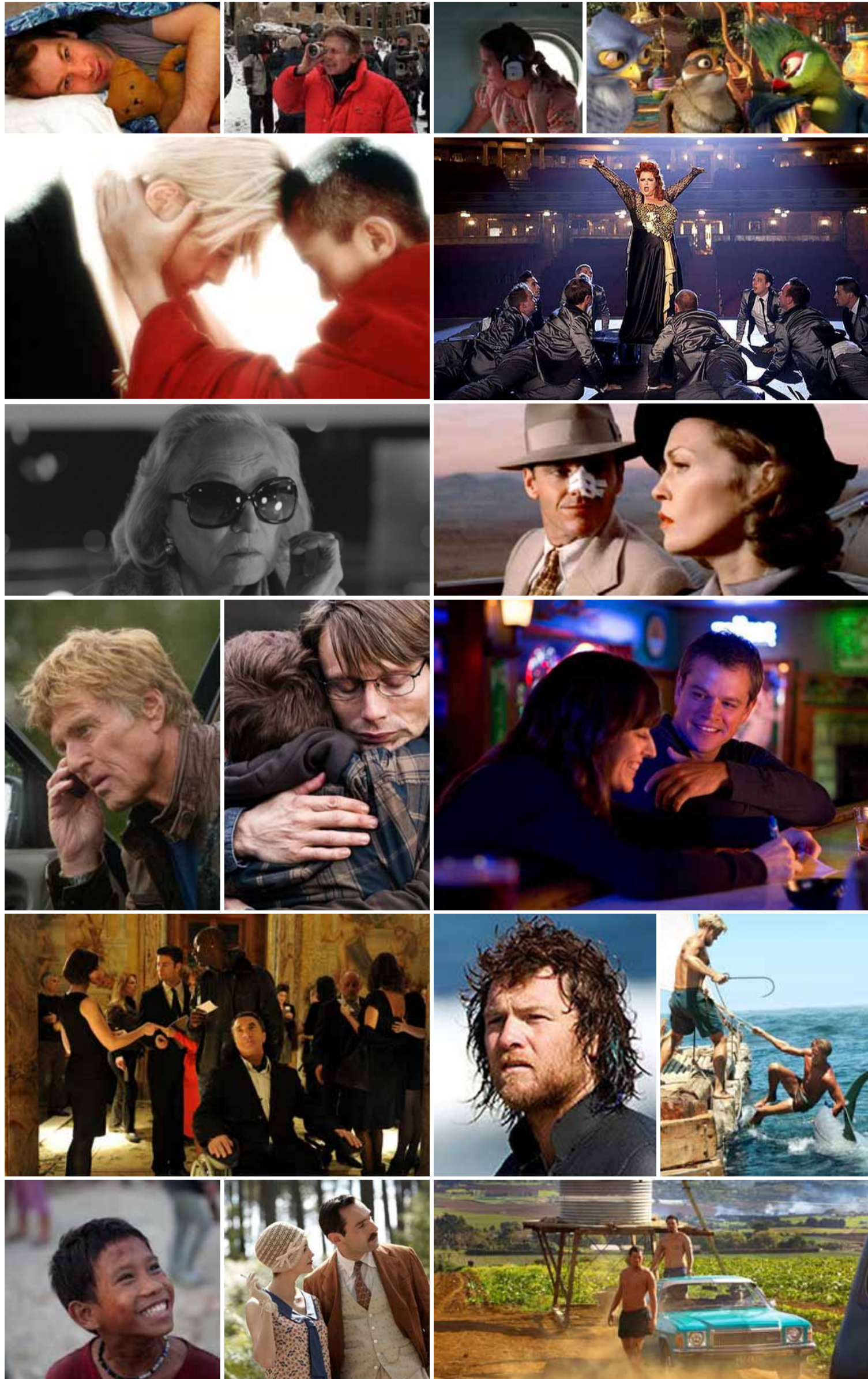

Adventures in Zambezia (G) 105m

2013, Wayne Thornley, South Africa

Set in the bustling bird city of Zambezia on the edge of the majestic Victoria Falls, *Adventures in Zambezia* is the story of Kai - a naive, but high-spirited young falcon - who travels to the city to discover the truth about his origins. In defending the city, Kai learns how to be part of a community.



Alias Ruby Blade (UC15+) 78m

2012, Alex Meillier, USA

Kirsty Sword Gusmão went to East Timor as a documentary maker and became a revolutionary and First Lady. As 'Ruby Blade', an underground operative, she met and fell in love with imprisoned leader 'Xanana' Gusmão. Intrigue, romance and revolution come together in this action-packed documentary chronicling the tumultuous birth of a new nation in Timor-Leste through a never-before-seen perspective.



Chasing Ice (M) 75m

2013, Jeff Orlowski, USA

Traveling with a young team of adventurers by helicopter, canoe and dog sled across three continents, Balog risks his career and his well-being in pursuit of the biggest story in human history. His Extreme Ice Survey discovers undeniable evidence of our changing planet. Balog deploys revolutionary time-lapse cameras designed for one purpose: to capture a multi-year record of the world's changing glaciers.



Chinatown (M) 133m

1974, Roman Polanski, USA

This critically acclaimed detective film sees Jack Nicholson star as a private detective investigating an adultery case stumbles on to a scheme of murder that has something to do with water. This classic mystery film is directed by the notorious film-maker Roman Polanski and also stars Faye Dunaway.



Drift (M) 113m

2013, Morgan O'Neill / Ben Nott, Australia

Set in a remote town on Australia's spectacular and rugged coastline in the early '70s, *Drift* tells the story of two brothers at the genesis of the modern surf industry. Determined to escape a life of factory work and petty crime, headstrong older brother Andy and his wayward surf prodigy younger brother Jimmy form a volatile alliance. The brothers battle killer waves, conservative society and ruthless bikers to kick-start the modern surf industry.



Goddess (PG) 104m

2013, Mark Lamprell, Australia
25 June, 3 July, 12 July
Elspeth Dickens dreams of finding her 'voice' despite being stuck in an isolated farmhouse with her twin toddlers. She installs a webcam in her kitchen and her funny sink-songs make her an internet-sensation. While her husband is off saving the world's whales, Elspeth is offered the chance of a lifetime to fame and fortune. But when forced to choose between fame and family, the newly appointed internet goddess almost loses it all.



Kon-Tiki (M) 113m

2012, Joachim Roenning / Espen Sandbe, Denmark / Norway / UK

The Norwegian explorer Thor Heyerdahl crossed the Pacific Ocean in a balsa wood raft in 1947, together with five men. He wanted to prove that South Americans in pre-Columbian times could have crossed the sea and settle on Polynesian islands. The film tells the dramatic story about the triumphs and tragedies faced on this epic journey. Norwegian with English subtitles.



Mt Zion (PG) 96m

2013, Tearepa Kahi, New Zealand

Turei's family are hard-working potato farm workers in rural New Zealand. A talented musician, Turei dreams of his band being the support act for Bob Marley's 1979 tour. But it's a dream that challenges the traditions and values of his upbringing and will set him at odds with his family - particularly his father, a true man of the land.



Performance (M) 106m

2013, Yoram Zilberman, USA
13 Jul, 21 Jul, 26 Jul
Members of a world-renowned string quartet struggle to stay together in the face of death, competing egos and insuppressible lust. After 25 years of success, Peter, the cellist and oldest member, decides that he must retire when he learns he has Parkinson's Disease. For the others, that announcement proves a catalyst for letting their hidden resentments come to the surface. All this threatens to tear the group apart.



Promised Land (M) 107m

2013, Gus Van Sant, USA

A corporate salesman and his partner arrive in a rural town. With the town having been hit hard by the economic decline of recent years, the two outsiders see the local citizens as likely to accept their company's offer, for drilling rights to their properties, as much-needed relief. What seems like an easy job for the duo becomes complicated by the objection of a grassroots campaign.

Roman Polanski: A film memoir (M) 90m

2012, Laurent Bouzereau, UK

This is one of the most revealing portraits of a film maker. From his childhood in a Krakow ghetto, to his first films in Poland, an acclaimed career in Europe and America, and an Oscar win for *The Pianist*. Polanski also speaks out about the murder of his pregnant wife Sharon Tate in Los Angeles. as well as the controversy surrounding his arrest in 1977.



Seven Psychopaths (MA 15+) 106m

2013, Martin McDonagh, UK/ USA

The black comedy *Seven Psychopaths* follows a struggling screenwriter who inadvertently becomes entangled in the Los Angeles criminal underworld. His oddball friends want to help him regain his mojo and finish his screenplay by any means necessary; including kidnapping a gangster's beloved Shih Tzu.



Seven Years in Tibet (M) 136m

1997, J. Annaud, USA
18 Jun
The true story of Heinrich Harrer, an Austrian mountain climber, who travels to the Himalayan mountains. He became friends with a young Dalai Lama in Tibet at a time when China's takeover looms. The spiritual leader of this Buddhist nation has an impact on the Austrian.



Sleepwalk with Me (M) 81m

2013, Mike Birbiglia, USA
21 Jun, 29 Jun, 7 Jul
A burgeoning stand-up comedian struggles with the stress of a stalled career and a stale relationship. His anxiety comes out in increasingly funny and dangerous sleepwalking incidents. Mike Birbiglia wrote, directed and starred in this hilarious film, based on his off-Broadway show and best-selling book.



Tabu (MA 15+) 118m

2013, Miguel Gomes, Portugal
10 Jul, 15 Jul, 26 Jul
A restless retired woman teams up with her neighbour's maid to seek out a man who has a secret connection to her past life. The critically acclaimed film sees her return from modern day Portugal to explore colonial Africa when she was a farm owner at the foothill of Mount Tabu. Portuguese with English subtitles.



The Company You Keep (M) 122m

2012, Robert Redford, USA

A political thriller centred on a former activist in the radical organisation *Weather Underground*, after 30 years of an assumed identity, a journalist discovers he's wanted for murder. Starring Robert Redford, he goes in search of the one person who can help him clear his name before he loses everything.



The Hunt (MA 15+) 116m

2012, Thomas Vinterberg, Denmark

A teacher lives a lonely life, while struggling after divorce and custody of his son. His life slowly gets better as he finds love and receives good news, but his new luck is about to be brutally shattered by an innocent little lie. He is forced to fight for life and dignity. 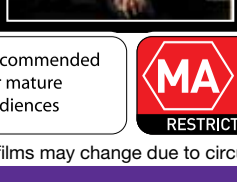
The Rocket (M) 92m
