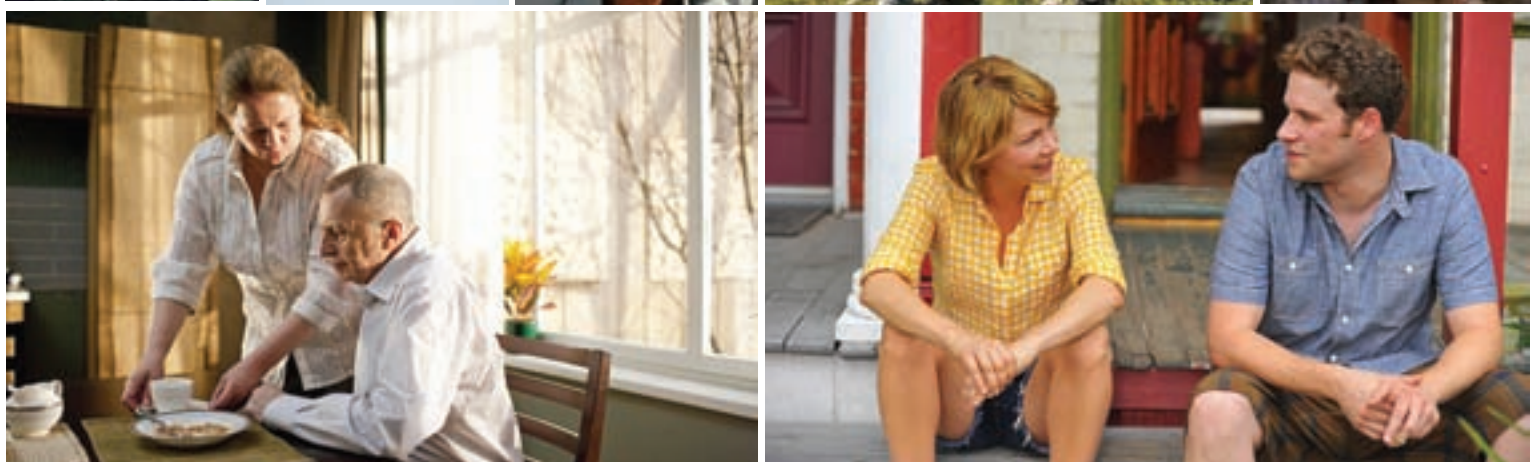

#### Earth (G) 95m

2008 Alastair Fothergill / Mark Linfield UK / Germany

14 Aug FREE Screening for CSIRO Science Week

This amazing nature documentary provides a sweeping family friendly tour of our home planet's biosphere and the animal populations which inhabit it. Over the course of a calendar year, Earth takes the viewer on a journey from north to south, showing how plants and animals respond to the power of the sun and the changing seasons.

#### Elena (M) 109m

2012 Andrei Zviagintsev Russian

14, 18 September

Sixty-ish spouses Vladimir and Elena uneasily share his palatial Moscow apartment. Estranged from his own wild-child daughter, Vladimir openly despises his wife's freeloading son and family. When a sudden illness and an unexpected reunion threaten her potential inheritance, she must hatch a desperate plan. Russian language with English subtitles.

#### Ice Age 4-Continental Drift (PG) 92m

2012 Steve Martino, Mike Thurmeier USA

30 Aug, 9, 14 Sep.

The amazing Ice Age fun continues with a continental cataclysm that triggers adventure for Manny, Diego and Sid. In the wake of these upheavals, Sid reunites with his cantankerous Granny, and the herd encounters a ragtag menagerie of seafaring pirates determined to stop them from returning home.

#### King of Devil's Island (M) 116m

2012 Marius Holst Norway

24 Aug, 4, 8, 15 Sep

Based on remarkable true events in Norway in 1915, this film tells an extraordinary story of friendship, loyalty and rebellion set on a remote ice-bound island reform school. A new inmate leads the boys to a violent uprising against a brutal regime. How far is he willing to go to attain freedom? Norwegian language with English subtitles.

#### Life in Movement (M) 79m

2011 Bryan Mason Australia

10, 15 Aug

In 2007 the Sydney Dance Company appointed 29-year-old choreographer Tanja Liedtke as their first new artistic director in 30 years. However before she could take up the position, she was struck and killed by a truck in the middle of the night. This documentary is not only a celebration of her work, but depicts the grief her collaborators must deal with as they embark on a world tour of her choreography.

#### Murundak – Songs of Freedom (M) 82m

A feature music documentary that journeys into the heart of Aboriginal protest music following The Black Arm Band, a gathering of some of Australia's finest Indigenous musicians, as they take to the road with their songs of resistance and freedom.

A feature-length dance film that takes the audience on a sensual, visually stunning journey of discovery straight onto the stage with the legendary Tanztheater Wuppertal Pina Bausch ensemble, and follows the dancers out of the theatre and into the city.

#### Spud (M) 107m

2011 Donovan Marsh South Africa

It's 1990 in South Africa but John Milton has more to worry about than the country's political happenings. Armed with only his wits and his diary, Spud must come to terms with this strange new world of books, bullies and boarding school.

#### Take This Waltz (MA15+) 112m

2012 Sarah Polley, Canada

4, 11, 24 Aug, 1 Sep.

When the happily married Margot meets Daniel they both feel an undeniable connection. Coincidences abound, seeming to draw these two people together as the film explores the familiar question of what long-term relationships do to love, sex, and self image. Starring Michelle Williams and Seth Rogan.

#### Swerve (M) 83m

2012 Craig Latiff Australia

31 Jul, 4, 12, 18 Aug

Driving cross country to a job interview, Colin happens across a fatal road accident. A briefcase of cash is part of the wreckage. Colin turns it over to police and a series of fateful events begins to unfold as the result. Another well crafted Australian thriller that will have you on the edge of your seat.

#### The Boy Mir 90m

2011 Phil Grabsky

3, 11 Sep

Following the international hit, The Boy who Plays on the Buddhas of Bamiyan, this film tracks the cheeky, enthusiastic Mir from a childish eight to a fully grown eighteen-year-old in one of the toughest places on earth - Afghanistan. Dari language with English subtitles.

#### The Lady (MA15+) 132m

2012 Luc Besson France

7, 13 Aug, 13 Sep

An intimate story about the peaceful quest of the woman at the core of Burma's democracy movement, Aung San Suu Kyi. A story of devotion and human understanding set against a backdrop of political turmoil. The epic tale of Burma's true national heroine.

#### The Raid (MA15+) 100m

2012 Gareth Evans Indonesia

30 July, 3, 29 Aug

Deep in the heart of Jakarta's slums lies an impenetrable safe house for the country's most wanted. As plans to infiltrate the site and take down a notorious crime lord go terribly wrong, Sergeant Jaka and his team must fight their way through the city's worst to survive their mission. Indonesian language with English subtitles.

#### The Woman in Black (M) 95m

2012 James Watkins UK

25, 31 Aug, 5, 16 Sep

Widowed lawyer Arthur Kipps is sent to a remote village to sort out the affairs of a recently deceased eccentric. He soon discovers that the house belonging to his client is haunted and the ghost is determined to seek out what was once hers. Starring Harry Potter's Daniel Radcliffe.

#### Tomboy (G) 82m

2011 Celine Sciamma France

6, 18, 31 Aug

A French family with two daughters moves to a new neighbourhood during the summer holidays. With her short hair and tomboy ways, Laure is immediately mistaken for a boy and passes herself off as Michael. This is a relationship movie: relationships between children, and the even more complicated one between one's heart and body. French language with English subtitles.

#### Trishna (MA15+) 113m

2012 Michael Winterbottom UK/India

7, 10, 15 Sep

A modern day re-telling of Thomas Hardy's classic novel, "Tess of the d'Urbervilles", with a contemporary Indian backdrop. Freida Pinto stars as the titular Trishna, a young woman who is seduced by the wealthy son of a property developer. As the romance develops, their relationship also becomes increasingly volatile.

#### Vincent Wants to Sea (MA15+) 91m

After the death of his mother, Vincent, a young man with Tourette's syndrome is institutionalised by his father. An escape and a road trip fueled by positive motives gives three young people the chance to discover life outside the walls of their former realities. #### Where Do We Go Now? (M) 98m

Set in a remote village where the church and the mosque stand side by side, the film follows the antics of the town's Muslim and Christian women to keep their blowhard men from starting a religious war. Together, they unite to distract their men with clever ruses, from faking a miracle to hiring a troop of Ukrainian strippers. Arabic/Russian language with English subtitles.
