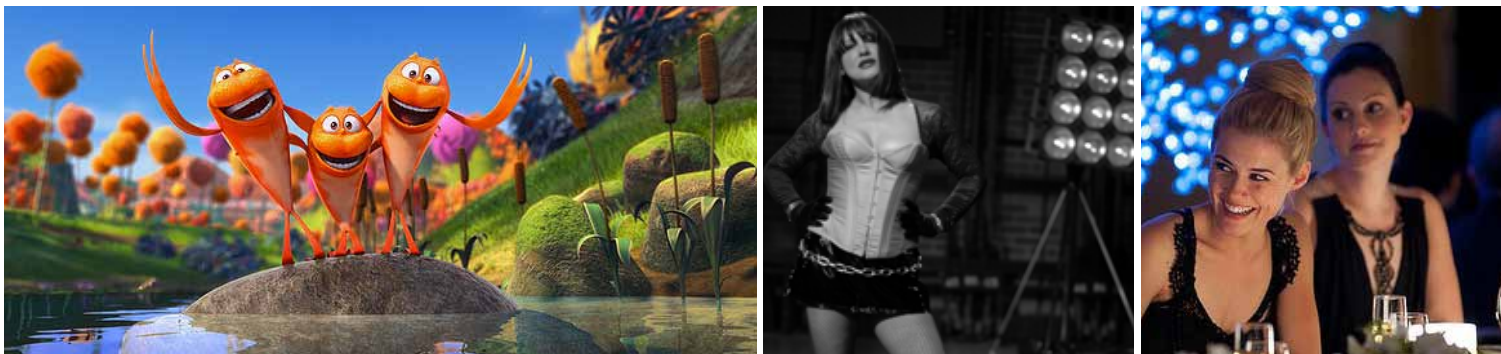

Black and White and Sex (MA15+) 91m
