27 Apr, 6, 9 May

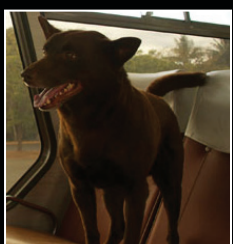

17, 19, 27 May, 1 Jun

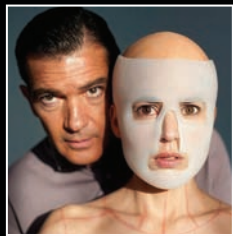

The Women on the 6th Floor (PG) 102m

Set In 1960's Paris this enchanting French comedy tells the story of the conservative Jouvett family, who are left to fend for themselves after their maid walks out. The new hired help – Maria, and her fellow Spanish maids, have a remarkable influence on the house as social and cultural barriers are challenged. (French language with English subtitles)



This Is Not A Film (G) 75m

An inspiring insight into the world of a brave and talented artist. Last year Panahi was banned from making, or scripting films for 20 years and placed under house arrest. Smuggled out of Iran on a USB stick, this 'non-film' is a powerful declaration of resistance from a visionary Iranian filmmaker. (Farsi language with English subtitles)

19, 21, 29 Apr, 2 May

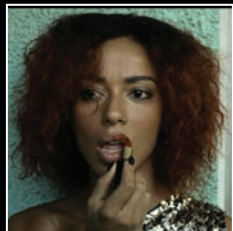
