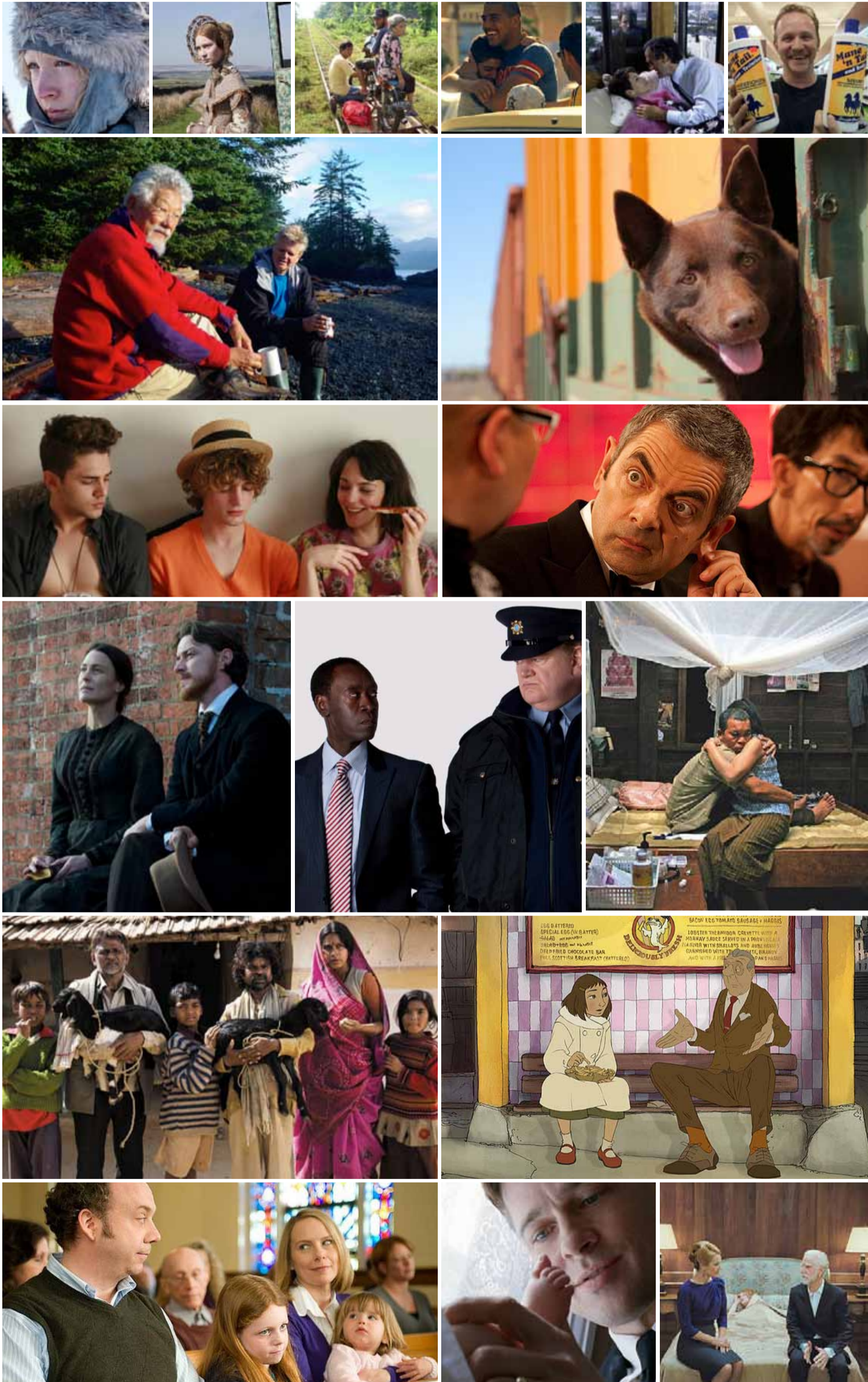

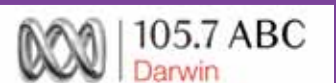

The third film in a trilogy following the Sjamsuddin family who represent a microcosm of the most important issues of life in Indonesia: corruption, conflict between religions, gambling addiction, the generation gap and the growing difference between poor and rich. 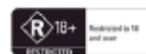


**Uncle Boonmee Who Can Recall His Past Lives (M) 114m**
