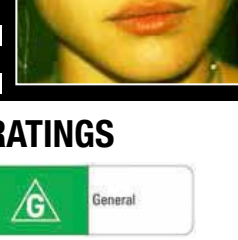
The Wrong Side of the Road M 80m

This landmark, award winning Australian film, combining elements of road-movie and musical, drama and documentary, was released in 1981. The harassment and discrimination that indigenous Australians routinely endured was exposed to an audience that had been largely oblivious, and contributed to an increased awareness of those issues in the wider Australian and international communities. Both bands in the film gained increased popularity, with "No Fixed Address" in particular achieving ground-breaking exposure on mainstream radio.



The musicians, their families and their community committed to the movie, and largely played themselves, under their own names, even though the story was fictionalised.
