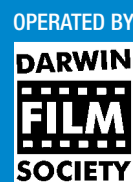

25, 29 June, 4, 8 July

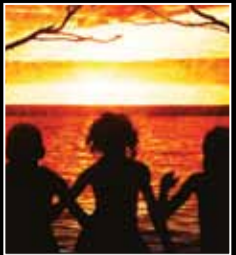

When a high school party goes dangerously off the rails, one teenager finds that revenge is just a computer click away. A striking Australian film with great emerging local talent.

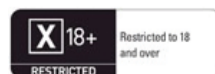
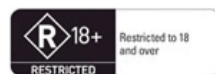
