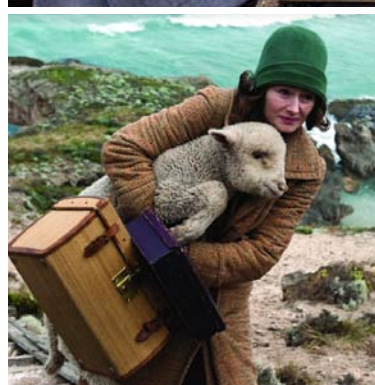

2010 Taika Waititi New Zealand
9, 12, 15, 18 Oct

A coming of age comedy set in the 80's on New Zealand's East Coast. Boy is obsessed with Michael Jackson and his dance moves, and his little brother, Rocky, possesses 'powers'. The pair are trying to find their potential, while living in the shadow of their larger-than-life Dad.

Creation PG 108m

2009 Jon Amiel UK
20, 24, 29 Sep

English naturalist Charles Darwin struggles to find a balance between his revolutionary theories on evolution and the relationship with his religious wife, whose faith contradicts his work. A psychological, heart-wrenching love story starring Paul Bettany and Jennifer Connelly.

Farewell M 109m

2010 Christian Carion France
22, 25 Sep, 3 Oct

A powerful espionage thriller based on little-known real events in Russia that led to the end of the Soviet bloc, when Brezhnev and Reagan were in power. Moscow, which usually looks grey and grim in this sort of film, positively sparkles as a backdrop.

I am Love MA15+ 120m

2010 Luca Quadagnino Italy
2, 8, 11 Oct

Tilda Swinton plays Emma: a demure, impeccably mannered Russian woman married into a wealthy family. The story tracks her sensual reawakening, not to mention slide from grace, when she falls in love with a younger man, a few rungs below her on the social ladder. Set in the lush, pampered world of the upper middle class in Milan.

Me and Orson Welles PG 114m

2010 Richard Linklater USA
4, 9, 15, 19 Oct

Set in art deco 1930s New York City, 17 year old student Richard is given a part in Julius Caesar by then unknown 22 year old Orson Welles. Richard is taught the ropes by a beautiful Sonja (Claire Danes.) This completely delightful film has at its core a mesmerizing performance from Christian McKay as the precocious young Welles.

Mother Fish M 92m

2010 Khoa Do Australia
23 Oct, 5, 8 Nov

Khoa Do (Young Australian of the Year 2005) and his family arrived in Australia by boat as refugees. This film gives a unique insight and understanding of their experience. Kim, a seamstress, is transported back to when she was a young girl escaping Vietnam by boat with family members. The power of the piece lies in the truth of the experience and performances, and also in the poetry of its resolution.

Second Hand Wedding PG 90m

2010 Paul Murphy New Zealand
6, 10, 12 Nov

Cheryl is planning the perfect wedding, but her garage-sale addicted, bargain hunting mother Jill threatens to ruin all her plans. A lovely comedy about family, friendship and loyalty, set on New Zealand's idyllic Kapiti Coast where the sunsets are spectacular and the parking still free.

Sistagirl 18+ 55m

2009 Donna McCrum & Andy Canny
12 Nov

Award-winning indigenous photographer Bindi Cole travels from her Melbourne home to the far north of Australia to document the beautiful transgender 'Sistergirls' of the Tivi Islands.

South Solitary M 116m

2010 Shirley Barrett Australia
24, 27 Sep, 5, 8 Oct

Miranda Otto stars as Meredith - a young, unmarried woman in this endearing Australian film, set in 1927, on a rugged and remote lighthouse island. Meredith arrives on the island with her uncle, the lighthouse keeper (Barry Otto) and has to adapt to this tiny, isolated community of workers and family.

Storm (18+) 105m

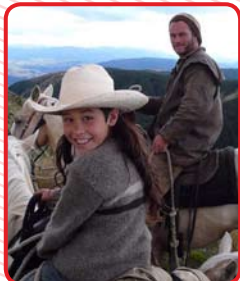
2010 Hans-Christian Schmid Germany / Denmark / Netherlands
21, 26 Sep

Storm has its Australian Premiere at the Deckchair Cinema as part of the Darwin International Film Festival. An intriguing legal thriller and tense drama that examines the politics surrounding the prosecution of a former Bosnian Serb Army commander for war crimes in the Hague and explores the personal and political integrity of those charged with ensuring justice.

The End of the Line G 82m

2010 Rupert Murray UK
23, 29 Oct

The End of the Line is the first major feature documentary film revealing the impact of overfishing on our oceans. Filmed over two years, the film follows investigative reporter Charles Clover as he confronts politicians and celebrity restaurateurs, who exhibit little regard for the damage they are doing to the oceans.



The Ghost Writer MA15+ 128m

2010 Roman Polanski France / Germany / UK
16, 20, 22, 25 Oct

When a successful ghost writer agrees to complete the memoirs of a former British Prime Minister he believes it's the opportunity of a lifetime. But the project seems doomed from the start - not least because his predecessor on the project died in a mysterious accident. A suspenseful thriller starring Ewan McGregor and Pierce Brosnan.

The Runaways MA15+ 106m

2010 Floria Sigismundi USA
2, 13, 17 Oct

Starring Kristen Stewart and Dakota Fanning, this film announces itself as raw and in-your-face. For a biopic about an all-girl 70s rock group that drew its influences from heavy metal and punk, it's an appropriate tone. Writer-director Sigismundi employs her skills to depict the highs of drugs and performing, but deploys a sober lens to depict the grit of the morning after.

The White Ribbon M 144m

2010 Michael Haneke Austria / Germany
1, 6, 10 Oct

The White Ribbon is set in the small community of Eichwald, Germany, in the year 1913, where life is almost feudal. In this sealed off world, strange, disturbing events take place at the rural school. Filmed in crisp black & white.

This Way of Life PG 84m

2010 Tom Burstyn New Zealand
25, 28 Sep, 1 Oct

This Way of Life is an intimate portrait of Peter Karena and his family. In their early 30's, Peter and Colleen have six kids and 50 horses. We follow them up into the Ruahine ranges and down to their hidden beach camp. Against these isolated backdrops we explore family relationships, their connection to nature, their keen survival skills and their absolute intimacy with each other and their horses.

22, 30 Oct

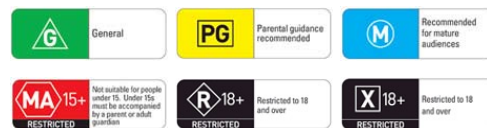
