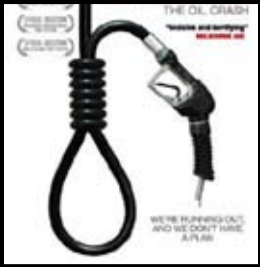

30 Sept, 6 October
A Hard Rain looks at the experience of countries overseas that have gone nuclear, it debunks some of the myths of the nuclear industry: that nuclear is safe, cheap, healthy and green with little chance of another Chernobyl happening.



Air Guitar Nation (M)

2007. USA. A Lipsitz. 82m

Air Guitar Nation follows a group of young, born-to-mock motorheads, all the way from the first East Coast air guitar championships in New York City to Finland. A rock journey not to be missed.



Black Sheep (MA15+)

Henry Oldfield returns to his family's farm, unaware that his brother is carrying out a baaad and reckless genetic engineering project. When inept environmental activists release a mutant lamb from a laboratory, thousands of sheep are turned into bloodthirsty predators.

2007. Australia. Rolf de Heer. 87m
24, 28 September, 2 October
Rolf de Heer's silent comedy is set in 1907 and recreates the look and feel of earlier silent films. Dr Plonk is attempting to engineer a time machine that will allow him to save the world from extinction in 100 years time. Starring Magda Szubanski.



The Story of the Kelly Gang (G)

1906. Australia. Charles Tait. 17m
Made in 1906 – arguably the first feature length film ever made. The remaining 17 min have been digitally restored which include Ned's final shootout. Recently became part of UNESCO's Memory of the World.



The Final Winter (G)

Australia. 2007. J Forrester. 96m
23, 27, 29 October
Set in the 1980's Australia, Club Captain Grub Henderson is faced with the sweeping changes of the game as Rugby League becomes a profession and no longer a sport. Written by and starring former League player Matt Nable. Also stars John Jarratt, Raelee Hill, Nathaniel Dean and Matthew Johns.



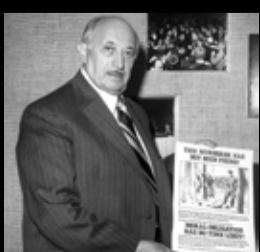
Forbidden Lie\$ (M)

2007. Australia. A Broinowski. 104m
22, 26, 31 October, 5 November
Norma Khouri's international best-selling memoir, "Forbidden Love", about an honour killing in Jordan, was exposed as a literary hoax in 2004. This doco unravels the intricate web of lies spun by Khouri in a gripping and irresistible journey full of on-screen confessions and audacious claims by the frauster.

25, 29 September, 7 October
An unruly class of bright, funny history students in pursuit of an undergraduate place at Oxford or Cambridge. Themes of history, homosexuality, sex and love underpin this honest and witty adventure.



I Have Never Forgotten You (M)

2007. USA. R Trank. 102m

The life and legacy of Simon Wiesenthal, the famed Nazi hunter and humanitarian. Features unseen archival film and photos, with interviews of longtime Wiesenthal associates, government leaders, friends and family members. Narrated by Nicole Kidman

21, 24 October
Six year old Vanya, in an extraordinary performance by Kolya Spiridonov, is an orphan adopted by an Italian couple, who needs to know if his birth mother still wants him.



The Jammed (MA15+)

11, 17, 20 October
A young Melbourne girl reluctantly agrees to help a Chinese lady search for her missing daughter. As the story unravels, the sinister workings of human trafficking, deportation and the sex slave trade are exposed. Inspired by actual events and court transcripts, this film is a gritty and shocking Australian thriller.

26 September, 1, 4 October
Katherine Heigl plays Allison, an up-and-coming entertainment journalist whose 24-year-old life is on the fast track. But it gets seriously derailed when a drunken one-night-stand with slacker Ben results in an unplanned pregnancy.

Marion Cotillard is splendid as Edith Piaf. Raised in poverty, Edith's magical voice and her passionate romances and friendships with the greatest names of the century made her a star all around the world. But in her audacious attempt to tame her tragic destiny, the Little flew so high she could not fail to burn her wings.

Norman Winther is one of the last trappers to live in harmony with the majestic Rocky Mountains. With his wife and faithful sled dogs, Norman lives his life as though it were an artform in this world where blizzards often wipe out worlds.

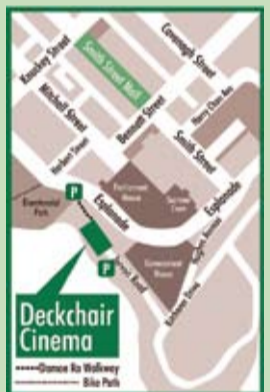
