






SLICE OF OZ CULTURAL HISTORY

dir Riyad Wsia India 1994, 62min. + short 'Hevvy' was the cry as she swung from the chandeliers, threw goons from speeding trains and leaped from horse to aeroplane. 'Hevvy' as she whipped men, tossed and punched their collective solar plexuses. Born Mary Evens, Perth 1910, Fearless Nadia thundered with shorts, sequined jackets and highboots, into the hearts of the indian movie-going audience with the 1935 film Hunterwali. India's first screen feminist had men, women and children dancing their tango, spawned and entire genre, and was an icon of good against evil. 2, 4, 6, 11, 12 August
