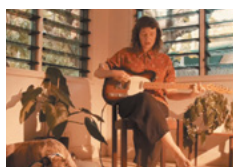
The multi-talented Tom E Lewis has graced the Deckchair screen many times, this is the first film clip from the album *Beneath The Sun*. Screening 22 July.

Alice Cotton / Music video

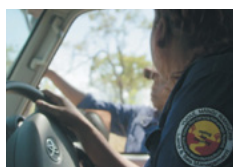
A beautifully tender reflection on ending a first queer relationship. It features an Auslan interpreter and the sulky greyhound Bluey. Screening of 9 June.
