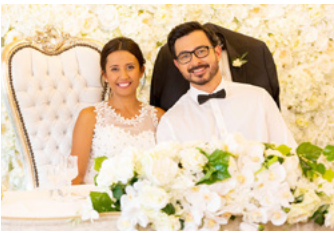

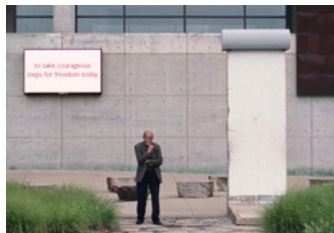


Sunday Too Far Away

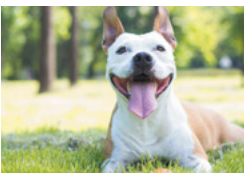
